INTRODUCCIÓN

A partir de la cada vez mayor importancia que la *Circumpolaridad* tiene en el mundo contemporáneo, en sus vertientes Norte (Ártico, incluyendo Alaska, norte de Canadá, países nórdicos, países bálticos, Finlandia, norte de Rusia) y Sur (Antártida, Patagonia, Tierra del Fuego, Islas del Atlántico Sur, incluyendo África meridional, Nueva Zelanda y Australia), en términos de convergencias y divergencias de una problemática que atañe a comunidades locales más o menos estables ubicadas en ambientes extremos, se llevan a cabo las ***I Jornadas Internacionales sobre Circumpolaridad Norte y Sur (Aproximaciones Socioeconómica y Sociocultural)*** y la ***III Muestra de Cine Circumpolar***, convocando tanto a especialistas – nacionales y extranjeros– de distintas disciplinas provenientes de las ciencias sociales, antropológicas, políticas, económicas y de las artes, así como a líderes de organizaciones públicas y privadas relacionadas con esta problemática, de cara a la dilucidación y puesta en común de la *Circumpolaridad* en su multi-dimensionalidad, interdisciplinariedad y bi-polaridad geográfica.

El evento cuenta con los auspicios de la *International Association of Circumpolar Sociocultural Issues* (IACSI), organización que nuclea a importantes científicos sociales y culturales del mundo sobre la problemática circumpolar norte y sur desde el punto de vista socioeconómico y sociocultural, y una red que comprende distintas universidades tales como la Universidad de Islandia, las Universidades de Laponia, Jyväskylä y Oulu (Finlandia), el Programa de Estudios Circumpolares (DI-VRID, USAL, Argentina), la Universidad de Québec à Montréal (Canadá), la Universidad de Cambridge (Reino Unido), entre otras. También se cuenta con los auspicios del *Centro Internacional de Conservación del Patrimonio* (CICOP) y la Fundación de Altos Estudios Antárticos y Ambientes Extremos (FAE, Argentina).

La organización y coordinación general de las Jornadas y Muestra está a cargo del *Centro de Investigaciones sobre Comunidad Local & Participación* (CICLOP), de la Facultad de Ciencias Económicas de la Universidad de Buenos Aires. Precisamente, el estudio de las comunidades locales en términos de pertenencia, participación, estrategias adaptativas y desarrollo sustentable –con especial referencia a los ambientes extremos– se inscribe dentro de los objetivos primordiales del CICLOP.

Teniendo en cuenta la cada vez mayor relevancia de la problemática Sur-Norte, así como la creciente importancia tanto de la Circumpolaridad Sur como del Norte, en cuanto a la resolución de la ecuación local/global en términos de equidad y equilibrio regional e internacional, amén de la crucialidad y envergadura que la problemática antártica/circumpolar sur ha ido adquiriendo con el correr de los años, se considera de alta pertinencia el desarrollo de estas Jornadas Internacionales y Muestra filmográfica.
